But what about the race? How did Lupi the temporary jockey fare




with his horse?

Box Hill South was



Nearly 600 years' service and experience are shared by 13 State Bankers who received gold ingots from chief executive Bill Moyle for their 40-year career milestone awards this month.




For Noel Hopkins, the presentation was a double celebration because it came on his 58th birthday.

Ken Bremner has been 'reappointed senior coach of the Tigers for the second year and the team is already training for next football season which starts on April 4.


Ken's appointment and three life members – David Jenkins, Danny Hayes and Stuart Cloke were announced at the club's annual general meeting on November 5.

#### Taking stock by computer

An NCR computer network has been installed in the social club office in State Bank Centre to streamline services offered by the social club.

The network includes five work stations on-line to a personal computer controller and an "intelligent" cash register.

The cash register stores information such as the number of sales and stock in the store.

The information is used

for computer accounting. The register has a wand to read bar codes on goods and stock numbers from the controller are fed into the register to price goods quickly.

The work stations will be used for the production of Staffline and letters, mailing and membership lists, information on suppliers and stock, and social function bookings.

Information on times and venues of functions can be quickly called up to answer inquiries.
